Loma Linda Academy Children's Center is a Seventh Day Adventist Christian Preschool. We are one of four campuses in the Loma Linda Academy family. God is intertwined with everything we do. Each morning every classroom has their own morning worship to invite God to guide them throughout the day. Each class prays before meals thanking Him for the food and to nourish our bodies. The Children's Center has three different curriculums that tie into each other.

The infant/toddler curriculum is based off of Milestones which allows for individualized curriculum. Routines are based on an on-need basis; discovery time is scheduled between sleeping, diapering and feeding.

A Framework for the Day's Events that Supports Children's Security and Independence

Following a consistent routine day after day gives children the sense of security they need to make choices and take risks, which opens the door to exciting learning opportunities.

**Small-group time** — during this time, a small group of children meet with an adult to experiment with materials, try out new skills, and solve. Adults develop a small-group activity based on children's interests and particular skills, materials, or content areas that suit children's developmental learning needs. Though the adult plans the activity and sets it in motion, children make choices about how to use the materials and freely communicate their ideas.

Eating and resting times – Meals and snacks allow

children to enjoy eating healthy food in a supportive social setting. Rest is for napping or quiet time. Since both activities happen at home, as well as, at school, adults try to respect family customs at these times as much as possible.

**Cultural Connection Corner** we will be studying about the seven continents which will be divided up throughout the year. Putting a global view into our local community.

The Children's Center has partnered with the Linda Valley Villa. The seniors come over and read books and do other fun activities with the children. In turn the older children take field trips over to the Villa and sing to the seniors. It has been a great partnership bringing the two generational worlds together.

During the school year we have a hot lunch program. Tickets can be purchased and when you want your child to have hot lunch you place the ticket in the clear box located in the front office. The meals are all vegetarian. We serve two snacks each day, a morning snack and an afternoon snack.

We are blessed to have animals here at the Center. We have rabbits, chickens, a pig, and last but not least a goose. The children love interacting with them, and watching them throughout the day.

We have a music program that comes to the Center on a weekly basis starting with the two year olds. The teacher goes from class to class introducing the children to music theory and instruments, it is brought to us by the Redlands Conservatory of Music [www.redlandsconservatory.org](http://www.redlandsconservatory.org)

Amazing Athlete's brings to the Center a sports curriculum giving every child a chance to learn the fundamentals of different sports.
